ISADORE GOTHOT DIES SUDDENLY

Dillonvale Resident is Stricken at Wheeling Hospital

DILLONVALE, July 2—**Isadore Gothot**, 52, native of Belgium and resident of Dillonvale for 42 years, died suddenly at 6:55 p. an. Friday at the Ohio Valley General hospital in Wheeling. Mr. Gothot had been removed to the hospital June 15 to undergo an operation for Bright's disease. The operation, however, revealed that he was suffering from cancer. He grew steadily worse until yesterday when members of his family and relatives were summoned to his bedside. He died before their arrival. Born May 27, 1880, in Belgium, Mr. Gothot came to this country when he was 10 years old with his family who made their home in Dillonvale. Surviving are six children, Hector, 24, Julia, 22, Joseph, 19, Alice, 18 Paul, 17 all at home and Mrs. Adele Di Moscio of Akron. One brother Dennis of Philadelphia, and six sisters, Mrs. Salem Maud of Adena, Mrs. David Whiteleather of Canton, Mrs. George Cook, Mrs. Clyde Woods, Mrs. James Burden and Mrs. Carl Lingelselter, all of Alliance. His father, Joseph Gothot of Alliance also survives. Funeral arrangements are Incomplete.

Franz was employed with Gouttiere's Pastry Shop, Kroger's Grocery Stores as a refrigeration specialist, Electric Autolight on Hamilton Street in Toledo, Ohio and lab technician for Dana Corporation on Bennett Road. He was a lifelong member of St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Maumee where he was a member of the Church Cemetery Board. He enjoyed woodworking; he made a four poster cherry wood bed from his own plans after having made his own draw knife to carve the four eight sided posts. Franz also constructed four Emperor Grandmother's clocks, one for each of his children; two sets of bookcases for his son, John; an overstuffed chair which was a high school woodworking project that is still in the family and utilized on a day to day basis; couch, a Queen Ann Secretary; and children's toys and furniture.
