In 1937 he went to Rock Springs where he was employed in the Blairtown coal mine until his retirement, at which time he moved to Pinedale. The 58 year-old veteran of World War I is survived by one son, William of Lewistown, Mont., a sister Mrs. Michael Cools, of Ridgetown, Ontario, Canada; and a brother, Emil, of Norwood, Winnipeg, Canada.

They lived on a farm three miles east of David City for five years before moving to Kimball County, Neb., in 1930 where George worked as a hired hand until they moved to their farm northwest of Bushnell, Neb. They lived there until retiring to Pine Bluffs in 1964. Mrs. Shandera was a member of St. Paul's Catholic Church in Pine Bluffs, Council of Catholic Women, Monday Women's Bowling League for many years and Busy House Wives Club.
